TRANSITIONS LIFECARE RECEIVES \$400,000 GRANT FROM THE DUKE ENDOWMENT

Transitions LifeCare received a \$400,000 grant from The Duke Endowment to establish telehealth capacity supporting palliative care services for adults in rural North Carolina. Using video visits, secure texting, and technology to notify staff of patients at the risk of hospitalization, the Endowment grant will allow Transitions LifeCare

to expand access and service area. In this way, we can best meet the needs of patients and families in rural counties within our eight county service area, while maximizing scarce palliative care staff resources.



"Telehealth improves access to needed healthcare. Transitions Kids, Transitions LifeCare's pediatric palliative care and hospice program, increased the number of

> patients served by 138% and extended the service area allowing for an increase in rural patient admissions," says CEO John Thoma.
