Transitions LifeCare receives \$100,000 grant from The Leon Levine Foundation

The Leon Levine Foundation ("TLLF") has awarded Transitions LifeCare a **\$100,000** grant to provide support for general patient needs and for Transitions Kids. Transitions LifeCare's CEO John Thoma knows

firsthand the challenges associated with providing quality, compassionate care – to all ages, and especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Last year, Transitions LifeCare provided nearly **21,000** telehealth visits at an estimated cost of

\$503,000. Transitions Kids, our pediatric palliative care and hospice program, increased the number of patients served by **138%** and extended the service area allowing for an increase in rural patient admissions. These needed and accelerated services would not have been possible without the generosity of our community.

"We're grateful to The Leon Levine Foundation for this grant that we know will allow us to continue our mission of caring for individuals and families with compassion, support, and expertise as they navigate the end of life or life-changing illness. Sandra and Leon Levine's generosity is well-known in this area,

- TRANSITIONS KIDS SIX YEARS OF PEDIATRIC HOSPICE AND PALLIATIVE CARE

Transitions Kids (TK) began providing pediatric
hospice care in September 2015, after a donation
from a local family foundation, to assure children
with life-limiting illness had the ability to
die in the location of their choosing
with the necessary support.

After a few months, it became

After a few months, it became apparent there was a need greater than hospice and TK was able to secure funding from additional supporters to expand services to palliative care.

Since serving our very first child in 2015, we have served 212 individual patients, 189 in palliative care and 46 in hospice care (some patients received both palliative and hospice care). We also support our families through bereavement services, some of whom received services that ranged from one month up to five years.

We serve kids in their homes, in the hospitals, through telehealth visits, and at our in-patient hospice home on Trinity Road in Raleigh. In 2021 to date, we are serving more than 90 children every day.
